

# Export as PDF for Adobe InDesign 1.52

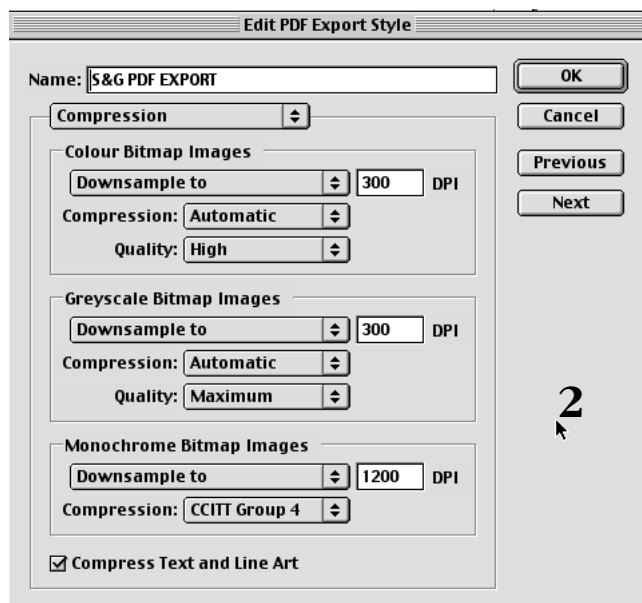
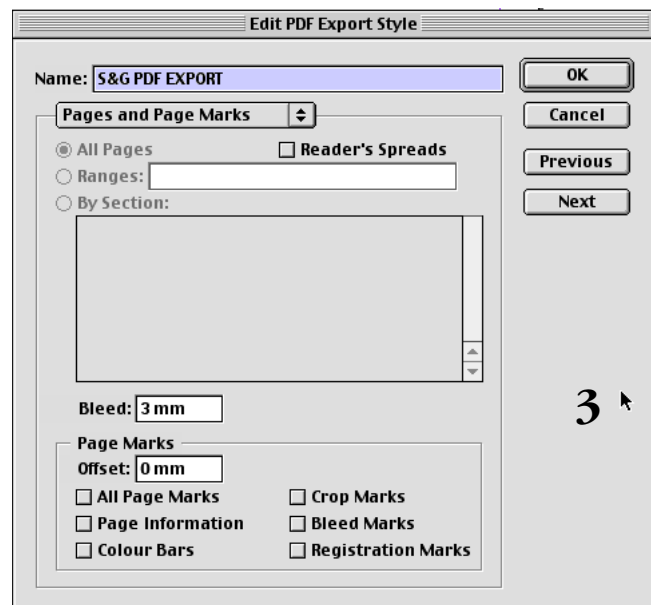
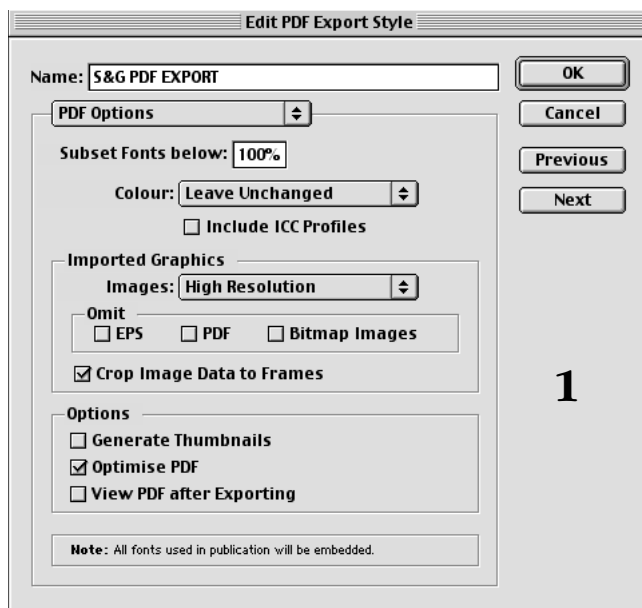
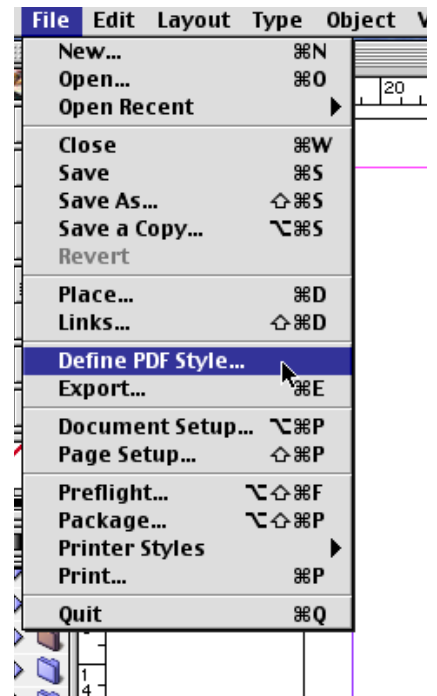
If you are utilising Adobe InDesign 1.5 onwards, you can utilise the 'Define PDF Style...' command. This enables you to save commonly used PDF-Export settings.

If you have Adobe InDesign version 1.xx you will have to skip this screen and continue with the PDF-Export settings

## Important Information for Adobe InDesign 1.xx

Please read the information below which describes a 'bug' within the PDF Export

**IMPORTANT:** Acrobat opens a PDF at a pre-determined default page size. If you view a PDF which has been generated within In-Design, you must set the crop value to 'none' in Acrobat and re-save your document. Once this has been performed, you will be able to view your PDF with bleed.
